TS'MSYEN TERRITORY

The Ts'msyen people consist of approximately 10,000 members who belong to seven different communities, including Lax Kw'alaams, Metlakatla, Gitxaala, Gitga'at, Kitselas, Kitsumkalum, and Kitasoo. They are considered one of the largest First Nations residing in northwest British Columbia. Some of the Ts'msyen people migrated to Annette Island in Alaska, where their descendants currently reside, known as Metlakatla, Alaska, with a population of around 1450.

TS'MSYEN HISTORY

Prince Rupert is situated on the ancestral land of the Nine Allied tribes of Lax Kw'alaams and Metlakatla, collectively known as the Coast Ts'msyen People. The local First Nations People have a rich history and vibrant culture passed down orally (through the Adaawx) and through totem poles, housefront paintings, ceremonial regalia, songs, dances, and feasts for thousands of years.

The Ts'msyen culture is a vibrant and diverse community known for its unique blend of seafaring, warrior traditions, and artistic prowess. The history of the Ts'msyen people, rich with tales of bravery and resilience, has been meticulously preserved and passed down from generation to generation through the oral tradition of Adaawx. These captivating stories, memorized by elders, chiefs, and matriarchs, are shared with the public during feasting ceremonies, offering a fascinating glimpse into the Ts'msyen heritage.

Of the seven Ts'msyen communities in Northwest BC, the two coastal communities, Metlakatla and Lax Kw'alaams, hold a special place. Lax Kw'alaams, aptly named 'Island of the Wild Roses,' is nestled approximately 35 kilometres north of Rupert, surrounded by the untamed beauty of the region. Metlakatla, located in the Metlakatla Pass, just seven kilometres northwest of Prince Rupert, is a gateway to the sea; its name, Maxłaxaala, means "Saltwater pass." These unique geographical locations have shaped the identity and way of life of the Ts'msyen people.

In addition to these communities, several other Nations from nearby territories are represented in Prince Rupert. These include the Gitxsan, Nisga'a, Haida, Tahltan, and Heiltsuk People.

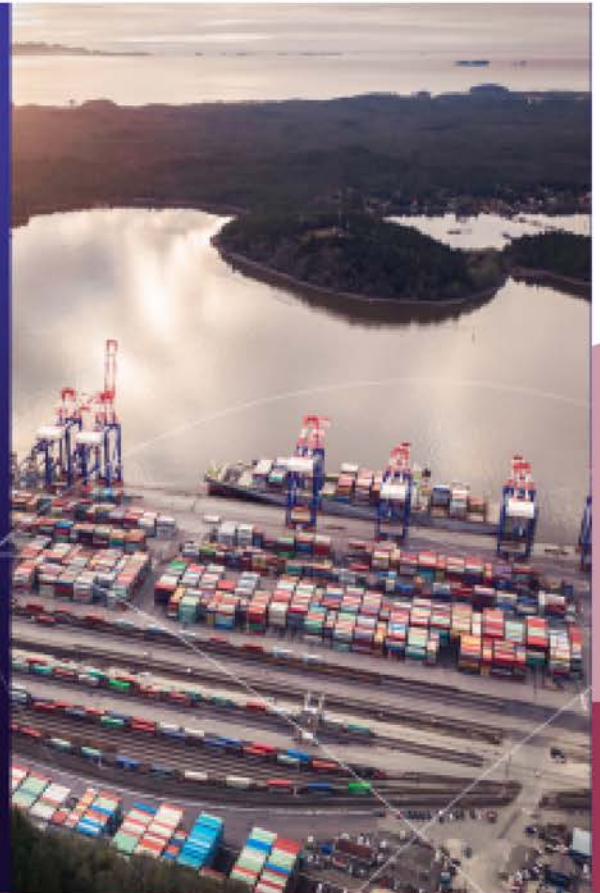

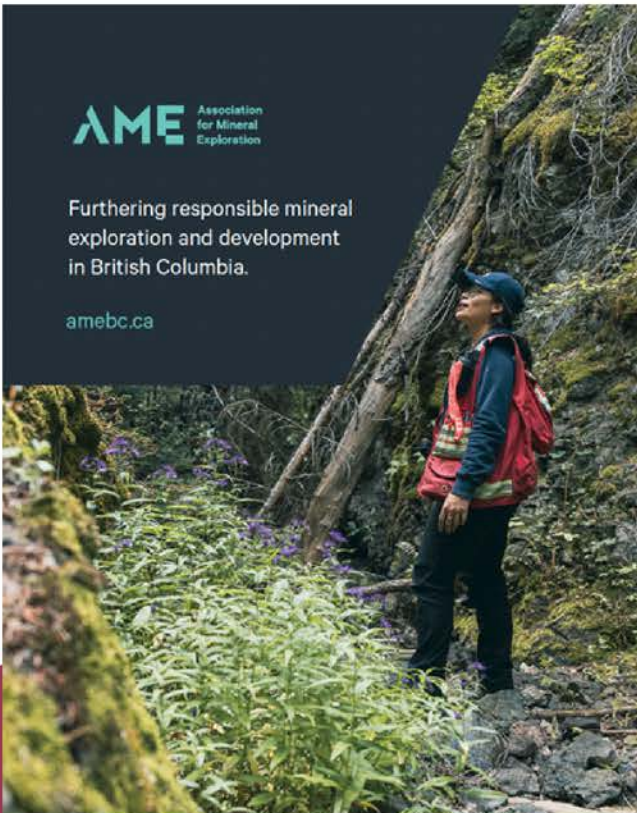
